

ELECTION DAY INCIDENT REPORT SUMMARY

Hotline / Mobile Responder Reports (Representative List)

- Voters asked to show ID
- Poll-workers not updating street index
- Partisan ballots requested by DTS voters treated as provisional
- Poll-worker gave voter pencil rather than pen to vote (might not scan)
- Polling place ran out of Democratic ballots
- Poll-worker gave AIP voter a Democratic ballot (not allowed)
- Poll-worker expressing negative opinion of Dem candidate to a voter
- Longtime Dems listed as Republican; poll-worker admits this is common
- Poll-worker cheered in a partisan way when voter reregistered as a Republican
- Inadequate/confusing signage; wrong street address listed
- No access for disabled voters
- DTS voters not informed by poll-worker that they could vote Dem
- VBM voter did not receive ballot
- Voter whose name was not on the roster not told of option to vote provisionally
- Public observer ejected from polling place after polls closed

ROV Election Observer Reports (Key Points)

- Concern about training and supervision of so many scanner operators
- Is anonymity protected when VBM ballots are separated from signed envelopes?
- High-school students breaking precinct box seals were inattentive
- Observer access to GEMS tabulation room more restrictive than in past
- In unloading precinct boxes from vans, no effort to ensure red seals weren't broken
- Many precinct boxes fell off transport carts used in Area 2; seals might have broken then
- Not all precinct boxes received in Area 2 were sealed
- Some spoiled ballots were being scanned in Area 4 (should not have made it past Area 2)
- Totally unmarked box observed in Area 3 and taken into the computer room
- Workers unloaded ballot packets from collection vans before entering loading area
